NOTICE TO BUILDING OCCUPANTSAND PARENTS

NOTIFICATION OF INSPECTION FOR ASBESTOS CONTAININGMATERIALS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued a final rule, 40 CFR Part 763, Asbestos Containing Material in schools, commonly referred to as AHERA. This rule requires all Local Education Agencies (LEA's) to identify asbestos containing materials (ACM) in their school buildings and to take appropriate actions to control the release of asbestos fibers.

All inspections for Cotee River Elementary have been completed and a Management Plan describing the results of the inspection and the action plan to control any asbestos found during the inspection, where applicable, has been submitted to the governor for approval. A copy of this plan is located in the administrative office of this school and at the Pasco County Schools Maintenance & Facility Services Department and is available for review upon request.

In order to facilitate communication between the school and parents in a timely manner the school uses School Connect Ed, student planners and a monthly parent letter that is sent both electronically via email as well as with the students each month upon parent request. In each newsletter, upcoming events, programs, and opportunities for parental involvement are highlighted to increase awareness. The use of the daily agenda book also provides an opportunity for teachers to communicate with parents about student progress and upcoming programs at Cotee River.

Please read the following carefully before moving on. Please be aware the application appearance has changed slightly.

Please submit only <u>ONE</u> application per household. If you submit an online application, you will NOT need to fill out the paper application. Filling out more than one application will delay the processing of your application. You will be notified by letter as to your child(ren's) eligibility status. Please have your FOOD STAMP CASE NUMBER and/or GROSS INCOME available prior to starting the online application process. The online screen cannot sit unattended for more than 10 minutes. If left unattended for more than 10 minutes, the system will automatically log you out. The online application has been correctly submitted once you receive a congratulations page with a confirmation number. Please print this page for your records. Applications are processed within 5-10 business days, depending on volume. Until your application is processed, you will need to provide your child(ren) a meal from home or send money to purchase school meals.

- The school, grade, birthdate of every student in your household
- Your social security number and electronic signature

A math block that includes fluency activities, conceptual development lessons with application, and a scholar debrief session.

Cotee River Art Club


