Too Sick for School – A child who has fever with a temperature greater than 100 degrees (orally), has been vomiting or has diarrhea must stay home for 24 hours AFTER the symptoms are gone without the use of over-the-counter medications to treat these symptoms. **Consider a medical evaluation for:**

- Fever that last 3 or more days
- Drainage from the ear
- Cough that continues for several days
- Repeated episodes of diarrhea or vomiting
- Rash
- Itchy eyes with clear or cloudy drainage
- Sore throat, with or without fever
- Cold symptoms that last more than one week.
- Children of all ages need 8-10 hours of sleep at night and good nutrition including adequate fluids (milk, juice, water). A child who is sick needs rest, plenty of fluids and "tender loving care.

School Choice Application Window

The School Choice application window for the 2020-2021 school year is January 21, 2020 to January 31, 2020. Parent notification and acceptance window is February 25 – March 5, 2020. School Choice application is only needed for Kindergarteners entering school for the 2020-2021 school year who live outside of the Cotee River attendance zone. If your scholar is currently at Cotee River on School Choice you do not need to reapply.

School Meal Application and Information

A post card with the below information will be sent to each household. A **NEW** application must be completed each school year.

The SY 19-20 Application will be ready on July 15th. Does your household qualify for free or reduced meals? It is easy to apply this year. **Visit**

www.pascoschoolmeals.com to apply online. If you do not have internet access, you can pick up a paper application at your child's school or have one mailed to you by calling 813-794-2281.

What you need to apply...

Your SNAP/TANF Case Number (if applicable) or monthly income amount and frequency for all people living in the household. Income includes: Earnings from work, Public Assistance, Child Support, Alimony, Pension, Retirement, or any other form of income received, excluding food stamp/SNAP benefits. Applications may take up to 10 business days to process. Please make sure to provide your student with money or a meal from home until you receive notification of eligibility. You can check the status after 10 days by emailing fns@pasco.k12.fl.us or calling 813-794-2281.

Meal Charge Policy Per School Board Policy, it is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to provide lunch for their children while at school. In the event that a child neither has a lunch or the funds to purchase a lunch:

- Elementary students may charge up to five (5) lunches (\$12.50)

- Middle school students may charge up to two (2) lunches (\$6.00) - High school students may charge one (1) lunch (\$3.25)

Charge limits reset as soon as the past due balance is paid.

A la carte items may never be charged.

When a student exceeds their charge limit, they will be given an alternate meal consisting of a ham &cheese sandwich, fruit, milk, and vegetable.

<u>CRES Clothing Closet</u> If your family is in need of any clothing items, we invite you to contact Mrs. Miller or Ms. O'Brien to set up a time during the school day to come in and get what you need. In the event transportation and/ or timing is an issue, we have created a form which can be sent home upon request (please call the front office). When we receive the request form, we will call your child/ children down to pick out the items requested and send them home in their backpack.
